**About the Presenters**

**Dr. Cheyenne Carter** holds a PhD in Counseling from the University of North Texas. She maintains a local counseling practice. Attachment theory continues to grow in prominence as the counseling field reacts to emerging research results and clinical modality development. In her seminar, Dr. Carter will highlight some of the less obvious attachment components of clients’ presenting concerns, thereby allowing clinicians to widen their lens when working with a variety of clients.

**Dr. Mark Scholl** holds a PhD in Counseling and Counselor Education from UNC Greensboro. His research interests include constructivist approaches to counseling, and career counseling for ex-offenders. In his afternoon seminar, Dr. Scholl will discuss recommendations for treating anxiety (e.g., social anxiety, generalized anxiety disorder) in children and adolescents. The presentation will include cognitive behavioral, and humanistic approaches and techniques.
